Parent to parent support allows families to learn, process and act on information and resources in a comfortable and supportive environment. In addition, the guidance and friendship of another parent who has experienced similar emotions, events and responsibilities often allows families to feel more at ease with an understanding that everything is going to be okay.

Guide By Your Side (GBYS) focuses on providing support and resources for Illinois families with children who are deaf or hard of hearing. GBYS works one on one with families matching a trained Parent Guide with each family. The Parent Guide meets with the family to discuss concerns, needs and share their personal journey of raising a child that is deaf or hard of hearing.


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
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## Quarter Reporting for: Jan 2020 – Mar 2020

- ➤ 27 Families referred; 22 Families matched Families referred may opt out of participating or may still be in the process of trying to reach them to enroll them within GBYS.
- **Ethnicity** of the families referred:
  - o 54% Caucasian (12 families)
  - o 31% Latino (7 families)
  - o 5% Pacific Islander (1 family)
  - o 5% Asian American (1 family)
  - o 5% Mulitracial (1 family)
- > Age of children enrolled in GBYS:
  - o 10% Birth-1 year old
  - o 18% 1-2 years old
  - o 10% 2-3 years old
  - o 31% 3-6 years old
  - o 31% 6 years and older
- **Primary Language** in the home:
  - o English 14 families
  - Spanish 3 families
  - o Dual language 4 families
  - o ASL 1 family
- Newborn Hearing Screening results as reported by the parent:
  - Did Not Pass 13 children
  - Passed –8 children
  - o Was not screened 1 child
- Gender of children enrolled in GBYS:
  - o 9 males and 13 females
- ➤ **Medical History** suggestive of:
  - o Condition assoc. with a hearing loss, 6 children
  - o No known syndrome or etiology 14 children
  - Hereditary 2 children
- Unilateral vs. Bilateral hearing loss:
  - o Bilateral 20 children
  - Unilateral 2 children
- Insurance information of enrolled families:
  - o Private 14 families
  - All kids/Medicaid 7 families
  - Dual coverage 1 family
